

HYMNS OF THE DAY

Resurrectional Apolytikion in the Third Mode

Let the heavens rejoice and the earth be glad, for the Lord by His Might, has created a Dominion. He has conquered death by death, and become the first-born of the dead. He has delivered us from the depths of Hades, and has granted the world great mercy.

Apolytikion for Abercius of Hierapolis in the Fourth Mode

A model of faith and the image of gentleness, the example of your life has shown you forth to your sheep-fold to be a master of temperance. You obtained thus through being lowly, gifts from on high, and riches through poverty. Abercius, our father and priest of priests, intercede with Christ our God that He may save our souls.

The protection of Christians unshameable, intercessor to our Holy Maker, unwavering, do not turn from the prayerful cries of those who are in sin; instead, come to us, for you are good; your loving help bring unto us, who are crying in faith to you: Hasten to intercession and speed now to supplication as a protection for all time, Theotokos, for those who honor you.

Receiving Holy Communion - We welcome to this celebration of the Divine Liturgy those Christians who are from other Christian Denominations and who are not fully united with us. Sadly, it is a consequence of the divisions in Christianity that we cannot extend to you an invitation to receive Holy Communion. Orthodox Christians believe that the Eucharist is the work or action of the celebrating Community signifying a oneness of faith, life, and worship of the believing Community. Reception of Holy Communion by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must pray. **However, all present** are welcome to partake of the Antidoro (blessed bread) which is distributed at the end of the Liturgy.

Epistle Reading

Prokeimenon. Third Mode. Psalm 46.6,1.

Verse: Clap your hands, all you nations.

The reading is from St. Paul's Letter to the Galatians 1:11-19.

Brethren, I would have you know that the gospel which was preached by me is not man's gospel. For I did not receive it from man, nor was I taught it, but it came through a revelation of Jesus Christ. For you have heard of my former life in Judaism, how I persecuted the church of God violently and tried to destroy it; and I advanced in Judaism beyond many of my own age among my people, so extremely zealous was I for the traditions of my fathers. But when he who had set me apart before I was born, and had called me through his grace, was pleased to reveal his Son to me, in order that I might preach him among the Gentiles, I did not confer with flesh and blood, nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were apostles before me, but I went away into Arabia; and again I returned to Damascus. Then after three years I went up to Jerusalem to visit Cephas, and remained with him fifteen days. But I saw none of the other apostles except James the Lord's brother.

GOSPEL

The Reading is from Luke 8:26-39

At that time, as Jesus arrived at the country of the Gadarenes, there met him a man from the city who had demons; for a long time he had worn no clothes and he lived not in a house but among the tombs. When he saw Jesus, he cried out and fell down before him, and said with a loud voice, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beseech you, do not torment me." For he had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many a time it had seized him; he was kept under guard, and bound with chains and fetters, but he broke the bonds and was driven by the demon into the desert.) Jesus then asked him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Legion"; for many demons had entered him. And they begged him not to command them to depart into the abyss. Now a large herd of swine was feeding there on the hillside; and they begged him to let them enter these. So he gave them leave. Then the demons came out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and were drowned. When the herdsmen saw what happened, they fled, and told it in the city and in the country. Then people went out to see what had happened, and they came to Jesus, and found the man from whom the demons had gone, sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind; and they were afraid. And those who had seen it told them how he who had been possessed with demons was healed. Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gadarenes asked him to depart from them; for they were seized with great fear; so he got into the boat and returned. The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him; but he sent him away, saying, "Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you." And he went away, proclaiming throughout the whole city how much Jesus had done for him.

Saints & Feast Days



October 22

Averkios, Equal-to-the-Apostles & Wonderworker, Bishop of Hierapolis

Saint Abercius, Bishop of Hierapolis in Phrygia in the times of Marcus Aurelius, was adorned with the grace of wonderworking and with apostolic zeal. During a festival in honor of Apollo, the chief deity of Hierapolis, the holy bishop was instructed in a revelation to destroy the idols. He went to the temple by night and overturned the statues of Apollo and the others. When this was discovered, the Saint boldly cried out that the gods, becoming drunk from the wine of the libations offered them, had struck one against another in their confusion. A multitude of furious pagans came to avenge the insult to their gods, but when the Saint cast the demons out of three afflicted young men, fear fell upon the idolaters and they with the whole city became Christian. After many labors, and afflictions, Saint Abercius reposed in peace about the year 167 (or, according to some, 186).



October 26

Demetrios the Myrrh-streamer & Great Martyr of Thessaloniki

Saint Demetrios was a Thessalonian, a most pious son of pious and noble parents, and a teacher of the Faith of Christ. When Maximian first came to Thessalonica in 290, he raised the Saint to the rank of Duke of Thessaly. But when it was discovered that the Saint was a Christian, he was arrested and kept bound in a bathhouse. While the games were under way in the city, Maximian was a spectator there. A certain friend of his, a barbarian who was a notable wrestler, Lyaeus by name, waxing haughty because of the height and strength of his body, boasted in the stadium and challenged the citizens to a contest with him. All that fought with him were defeated. Seeing this, a certain youth named Nestor, acquaintance of Demetrios', came to the Saint in the bathhouse and asked his blessing to fight Lyaeus single-handed. Receiving this blessing and sealing himself with the sign of the precious Cross, he presented himself in the stadium, and said, "O God of Demetrios, help me!" and straightway he engaged Lyaeus in combat and smote him with a mortal blow to the heart, leaving the former boaster lifeless upon the earth. Maximian was sorely grieved over this, and when he learned who was the cause of this defeat, he commanded straightway and Demetrios was pierced with lances while he was yet in the bathhouse, as for Nestor, Maximian commanded that he be slain with his own sword.

SERMON

THE WORD OF GOD THROUGH THE REVELATION OF JESUS CHRIST

The Gospel, according to the Apostle Paul does not come from man. The Lord Jesus revealed it to him. That is why the Truth of Gospel is enhypostatic, that is, it is identified with the Person of Christ. And yes, the Gospel of the Kingdom of God was revealed in a specific historical context, and was formulated in the language of the time, but at the same time, it does not cease having eternal and timeless status. Since the Gospel is Jesus Christ himself, Who is "the same yesterday and today and forever" (Heb. 13:8). This truth is the conscience of the Church. In the Small Entrance of the Divine Liturgy, the liturgist, holding up the Gospel, exclaims; "Wisdom arise." Behold the Wisdom of God, the presence of Christ in the midst of the Church and the hearts of the faithful; let us stand upright, in spirit and body, to express respect and our devotion to Him who became everything for man. And the gathering of believers hymns God by chanting: "come let us worship and fall before Christ...". Come everyone and let everything praise God, to worship and fall before Christ, embracing Him.

Therefore, the Gospel preached by Paul is not some human moral teaching, but the offering of his personal experience from his salvific communion and union with the Lord. Thus, the phrase "it is not according to man" does not mean the underestimation of the human factor on the part of Christ, but reveals the exaltation and validation of man as an accomplice of God in the work of salvation.

Christianity persecuted

From the beginning of its historical appearance, Christianity was persecuted both externally and internally, with particular cruelty. There are countless holy Martyrs who sacrificed their lives for the Gospel and the faith of Christ. In fact, as we have also pointed out at other times, it is characteristic that even in our days, Christianity is the only religion that is persecuted in every way and has martyrs to present all over the world, even today. The Apostle Paul himself in our passage today, after making a review of his life before his calling to the apostolic office, says that he passionately persecuted the Church.

And this, because he had great zeal for his ancestral traditions, and he was devoted to Judaism. However, while he was heading towards Damascus, in order to destroy the Church and imprison the Christians, he was granted to meet the Risen Christ. And then from a persecutor, he became persecuted, and from an opponent of Christianity, he emerged as the par excellence Apostle of Christ, who loved Christ more than anyone else. The Grace of God works these miracles both then and today.

The Slandering of Paul

The Apostle Paul in his letter to the Galatians, from which our passage comes, emphasizes that the Gospel of Christ justifies, saves man, through faith. And in general, he preaches that the crucifactory sacrifice of the Lord bears the acquisition of the goods of man's adoption by God, and his freedom from the yoke and the legal types of the Old Testament which, thus or otherwise, had a pedagogical and temporary character. However, Judaizing Christian false teachers, who surrounded the newly founded churches of Galatia that Paul founded, slandered him, causing tumult and scandal to the faithful. They argued that for salvation in Christ, it was necessary to observe the ritual provisions of the Mosaic law, and they tried to annul the work and shake the apostolic authority of Paul, who taught the release from the law of the Old Testament. Here we are talking about another form of

persecution, internal this time, which refers to the distortion of the gospel truth.

The Church, the bearer and guarantor of the truth

The Holy Orthodox Church, despite any inevitable human errors during its historical course and the non-compliance of certain of its representatives, does not stop preaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ, as a revelation of God to the world and an invitation to communion and union with Him. This is the Gospel of Truth; the Gospel of Paul and all the Saints; the criterion, in the end, of our conscience and the power of our rebirth in Christ.

Stella's journey from Thessaloniki, Greece to America begins with a pre-dawn taxi ride that she and her sister share while the coffin holding a loved one rides along in the taxi's trunk. Orphaned and separated from her younger sister "for her own good" as the culture dictated at the time, Stella ends up being adopted by a Greek couple that had emigrated to Boston, Massachusetts in the US. At age 11, she overcomes multiple losses and cultural differences to find a place in her new homeland, while finding ways to stay connected to those she loved in Greece.

This story of resilience and perseverance follows Stella's journey of becoming an "Amerikanaki" and eventually reconnecting with her sister, who had stayed in Greece with her own set of adoptive parents. Even as Stella embraces her new life and culture in America, she rebuilds her loving relationship with her sister after an eight-year separation. Later in life, the sisters take another taxi ride together, this time to recover important details of their birth parents' life stories that mirror the determination to survive and thrive that marks their own.

The book will be available for purchase—\$25/soft cover and \$35/hard cover.



Stella Nahatis is a talented writer who has recently captivated readers with her poignant memoir, *Taxi to America*. With a compelling storytelling style and an honest exploration of personal experiences, Nahatis takes readers on an emotional journey from Greece to America. Nahatis's background includes a career with Trans World Airlines and a strong commitment to helping others.
